About our Nursery

Our Nursery provision is led by a qualified Teacher and Teaching Assistants. Children are taught following a curriculum designed to support them in meeting the Early Learning Goals of the EYFS Statutory Framework. We plan engaging teaching and learning experiences, planned through themes and topics and enhanced by the children's interests, enabling each child to achieve and make links in meaningful and real-life contexts. We recognise that each child will develop at their own pace and in their own way physically, intellectually, socially and emotionally and we are flexible to accommodate this. The children have access to wonderful outdoor spaces including a pirate playarea, forest school and a garden, where children can continue their learning outdoors, whilst enhancing their physical development.

In addition, we provide daily after-school clubs such as cooking sessions and gardening sessions.

Nursery Sessions

Children can attend Nursery for full-day or half-day sessions, between 8:40am and 3:00pm, Monday to Friday. Breakfast Club and After-school provision is also available from 8:00am – 5:45pm daily

We are able to take children from the age of 3 years old. All 3 and 4 year olds in England are entitled to 15 hours per week of free early education or childcare and some may also be entitled to an additional 15 hours of free childcare per week.
