What is the Pupil Premium Grant?

Pupil Premium is an allocation of funding provided to schools to support children who may be vulnerable to underachievement. The Pupil Premium Grant includes pupils on the annual census known to have been eligible for free school meals in any of the previous six years, as well as those eligible at the time of the census. It also includes pupils who have been eligible for the Service child premium at any point in the last three years. All schools are required to report on the amount of funding and how this is being used.

Aims for the Pupil Premium Grant at Tilstock C.E. Primary School and Nursery:

The Interim Executive Board of Tilstock C.E. Primary School and Nursery have decided that this grant will be most effectively spent on supporting children's learning in the classroom by **providing high quality first teaching, curriculum support, targeted intervention, engagement and enrichment activities, pastoral support and social and behavioural intervention.**

Links to School Development Priorities include:

- Development of writing skills including grammar and spelling
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As with all children at our school, in order to ensure maximum impact, the needs of children entitled to the Pupil Premium are clearly identified, steps are taken to meet their individual needs and their progress is closely monitored through school. Where small group / 1:1/2 support is felt to be most beneficial Pupil Premium will be used to support this provision.
