### Daily stories for every child:

The benefits of children regularly listening to a story is huge. I am so pleased to know that each day all of our children are read to by their teachers. This helps develop imagination, listening skills, and a lifelong love of books. ## WORSHIP

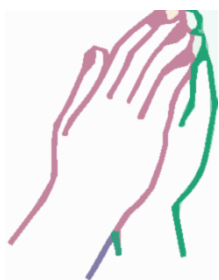


### PEACE
