Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come towards the end of the academic year, our thoughts turn to the events and routines that we would normally follow if we were all at school together.

For Year 6 children due to leave us on the 17th July, we have been working with our local secondary schools creatively to ensure that your child knows what to expect when they embark on the next stage of their education. For example, Sir John Talbot's School have provided a virtual tour on their Facebook page and will be conducting virtual meetings with the Year 6 class and making phone-calls to families at home.

For children due to start Reception or Nursery in September, we have sent out a Tilstock 'I'm starting school' e-book, provided twice weekly Early Years information clips with ideas of how you can support your child at home onto our Facebook page and each child will also be set-up with an online tapestry account, so that you can begin to link your child's learning between home and school.

Children's Summer Term reports will be sent home on Wednesday 15th July. For children not in school, these will be sent home by email, but you will be able to request a paper copy. The reports will be slightly different from the usual format, to reflect the lack of termly data since the Spring term.

The Government has now agreed to provide free school meals during the six-week school holiday to those who qualify through the benefit criteria. We currently provide supermarket vouchers to the value of £15 per child per week to our FSM families who are not in school (£90 per child to cover the holiday period).

Year 6 children:

Drop-off between 8:50- 9:00am. Pick-up between 2:50-3:00pm Please park your car and bring your child to the front right-hand SIDE GATE by Talbot class where Mr Paterson will collect your child. Please do not gather at the gate.

Year 1 children:

Drop-off between 9:00am and 9:10am. Pick-up between 2:40pm and 2:50pm.

Please park your car and bring your child to the rear PLAYGROUND gate, where Mr Gillespie will collect your child. Please do not gather at the gate.

Nursery and Reception children:

Drop-off between 9:10- 9:20am. Pick-up between 2:30 and 2:40pm. Please park your car and bring your child to the NURSERY gate, where Mrs Finch will collect your child from you. Please do not gather at the gate.

Children of keyworkers: Our

provision for children of key workers will continue to operate between 8:45am and 3:10pm. Please use the hall door where Miss Thomas will collect your child. However, if your child is in EYFS, Year 1 or Year 6, than please use the required drop-off/collection point and procedure for that year group. This ensures that your child does not enter/exit through other classes and mix with other 'bubbles' of children. I will ensure that a member of staff is on these points at 8:45am to welcome your child into school.

Read Write Inc phonics

To help children learning to read at home during school closure, Read Write inc are streaming 7 phonics, reading and spelling lessons every weekday on our YouTube channel. Each lesson is ten to fifteen minutes long and available for 24 hours.

Get Involved


