#### **Dear Parents and Carers,**

Hopefully, you should have now received two letters regarding September.

The first one outlined our class structure and the exciting news of an additional classroom to accommodate our growing numbers. Work will be completed over the summer to create the new classroom for Years 3 and 4, whilst the EYFS classroom will be updated with new furniture and resources. The staff have renamed all classes as Bumblebees (Nursery & Reception), Squirrels (Years 1 and 2), Otters (Years 3 and 4) and Badgers (Years 5 and 6).
