Dear Parents and Carers,

I met with local artist Sarah to talk about plans for our art mural to commemorate Queen Elizabeth II and King Charles III. She will be holding a whole school assembly on the 11th October, to give a talk on her job as an artist and the techniques they will be using to create our mural. She will also explain that they are going to 'commission' her, by giving their design ideas for Sarah to produce an outline for them to paint or 'colour in'. Each child will have a rectangular piece of paper to draw their ideas on. This will incorporate themes on our value of 'Hope", things to represent the late Queen and the new King, class names etc – but I would also love parents' ideas too – so please feel free to send in any drawings or designs you would like included onto our mural by Friday 18th November. Sarah will then come back in early December to spend a day painting the mural with all pupils, staff, governors - and parents will be invited in to take part too.
