Welcome back!

It was so wonderful to see so many happy smiling faces at the gate this week. I have spent the day visiting class and joining in with their creative and engaging activities. I have been so proud of how they have all settled back in so quickly and have got stuck into their learning. We have had lots of exciting learning across the school this week, and I have been focusing on supporting children with their attitudes towards their learning. Sometimes, new tasks and activities can be overwhelming for children, and so we are trying to instil the value of Hope into their learning, to enable them to see that they may not be able to do something....yet, but if they hope and try, and have a positive attitude they will get there in the end. To help the children understand the meaning of this value, I read them the story of *The Hope-o-potamus* in worship this week. *The Hope-o-potamus* is a rhyming story written by Greg James and Chris Smith. It can be found inside *The Book of Hopes*, and it tells the most beautiful story of a Hippo, who doesn't give up on his hopes, even though he is tired, fed-up and tempted by others to give-up. We set the challenge to our children to show hope in their daily lessons and around school.

Each class is beginning their exciting new learning journeys. We have 'What makes Britain Great?' in Squirrels, 'London's Burning' in Otters and 'Ancient Egypt' in Badgers. Our Prayer for hope

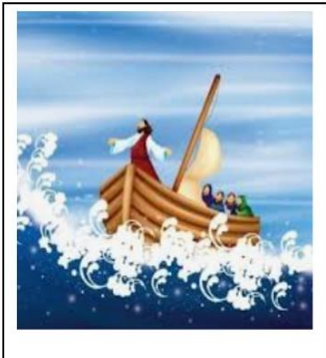
Dear God,

School uniform

Full details of our uniform policy is on our school website. We have reduced the number of branded items children are required to wear.

In order to maintain a sense of belonging and shared identity, there will be items that remain compulsory, and we have detailed below which items these are. We have also provided a list of required items, even though these are not required to contain the school logo.

Branded items that are required:

- School sweatshirt or cardigan

Non branded items that are required:

- Turquoise polo shirt (order from RAM leisure)
- Black school trousers
- Black school skirt
- Black tailored school shorts
- Blue summer dress
- Plain black PE shorts
- White t-shirt or polo shirt for PE
- Plain black unbranded jumper (not hoodie) worn for PE

In addition to the reduction in branded items, we have also worked with our uniform supplier to offer free delivery to schools once per month. Therefore, if you place an order online by 15th of each month, items will be delivered to your child's school by 30th of that month free of charge.
