Dear Families,

Welcome back a welcome to the Summer term!

We have an exciting and engaging curriculum across the school, led by themes. Our whole school focus this term is on Geography, and this is reflected in topics in classes. Squirrels will be learning about the seaside and how this has changed since the Victorian period.

Otters will becoming enthusiastic mountain experts! Locating the highest peaks, identify mountain ranges, and research key facts about these, creating 3D mountain models and presentations to share expertise! They will also learn about The Tudor reign. The Tudors were a Welsh-English family that ruled England and Wales from 1485 to 1603 - one of the most exciting periods of British history.

In Badgers, their Geography theme explores the rainforest, extreme environments such as Death Valley and the Antarctic, and the theory behind why these places have evolved to be what they are today. Badgers' history unit, 'Crime & punishment' provides pupils with a broad chronological sweep of nearly a thousand years and makes a significant contribution to pupils' grasp of the long arc of time. We have concentrated on what motivates pupils: stories about criminals and how fairly they were dealt with. With all enquiry questions the object has been to open up informed debate, relating issues to the present day wherever possible. In this way the topic makes a major contribution to pupils' citizenship education.
