For the best view, find a spot away from lights and bring along binoculars or a small telescope for a closer look at the fainter planets. Don't miss this chance to witness a cosmic event that won't happen again until 2040!

E-mail Protocol for Parents

We want to continue to support our parents by responding to parental queries at the earliest opportunity, however we are finding an increasing number of emails to staff in the evenings and weekends, with an expectation that emails will be answered straight away.

We will continue to monitor our approach to communication to improve the process further and are welcome any feedback you may have.



Well done to our Mathematicians!

We want our children to know more and remember more and the 99 Club aims to do just that. We know that practice helps our children to embed knowledge into their long-term memory, and with repeated practice of their calculations, we hope to improve their recall of addition, multiplication and division facts. This should result in increased speed and confidence when tackling mental maths problems without relying on written workings and methods.

All pupils will begin at the 11 Club. They will have weekly opportunity to answer all calculations at their current level, unaided and within five minutes. If all of the calculations are answered correctly twice in a row, the child moves up to the next level! The initial 11 Club involves eleven problems which involve doubling numbers up to ten ie. 5+5, 8+8. The 22 Club then adds eleven further questions involving repeated addition for numbers from one to ten ie. 3+3+3+3, 5+5+5+5, while the 33 Club begins to introduce times tables. Division facts are added by the time a pupil reaches the 77 Club, and in the 88 Club and 99 Club, pupils will be tackling a range of mixed multiplication and division problems. The ultimate challenge is to complete all 99 questions of the 99 Club unaided, with no errors and within five minutes! Are you up for the challenge? Want to find out more?
