Dear Parents and Carers,

As we move from September into October, the children have also been noticing the changing of the seasons. In worship, we talked about the Autumn Equinox, learning that the word equinox comes from Latin meaning equal night—a time when day and night are of equal length. This marks the beginning of longer, darker evenings and cooler weather.

During my learning walks this week it has been wonderful seeing Bumblebee and Squirrel classes enjoying their fantastic new all-weather outdoor area, complete with a beautiful canopy that allows learning to take place outside—rain or shine!

This thoughtfully designed space has quickly become a rich part of our continuous provision, enabling children to follow their interests, develop independence, and apply skills across the curriculum in purposeful, hands-on ways. Our Squirrel Class children have made excellent use of the area, engaging in open-ended exploration such as digging in the mud, investigating soil, and discovering a range of insects and other minibeasts. These experiences have sparked curiosity about the natural world and supported their understanding of Science, particularly the "Working Scientifically" strand—observing closely, asking questions, and identifying and classifying living things. The outdoor provision also encourages: Physical development through digging, lifting, and transporting natural materials; Motor skills—both fine and gross—as children manipulate tools and navigate the space; Communication and language skills as children share discoveries, describe what they find, and use new scientific vocabulary in meaningful contexts

It has been truly beautiful to feel and see the seasonal changes through the eyes of the children, the crisp air, the golden leaves, and the shifting light—all of which enrich the children's outdoor experiences and deepen their connection to the world around them.

What is it? The Early Help Front Door Service is a single point of contact for children, and their families, focused on making sure that the right support is put in place as soon as it is needed.






